





It is with sincere sadness that I begin my piece this month with the tragic news of the recent death of Francis Usmar – the Chair of Governors who immediately preceded me. Regrettably Francis had to resign suddenly due to a family emergency shortly after I became a governor, but I remember how well he ran our meetings; his lightness of touch married to his clear grasp of all the issues impacting the school and the staff, warranted the obvious respect with which he was held by all of us governors and teachers alike.

It is in great part thanks to Francis's determination and dedication in leading the campaign to allow the school to grow from a tiny infant school under threat of closure, into the full primary school, that Froxfield's school exists today. Francis's memory will continue to be honoured annually with the awarding of the Francis Usmar Prize for the Key Stage 2 child who has contributed greatly to school life – as Francis himself contributed to the creation of Froxfield CE Primary and Preschool - his legacy lives on in our thriving village school.

The autumn term is well under way, all the new little ones in Reception have learnt where their coat pegs are and how to navigate the whole school day, the rest of the older children are settling into their new classrooms and everyone is enjoying the exciting new equipment available for them at playtime.

We governors were pleased to learn that the additions to the playground, including a large tyre swing the creation of 'Dinosaur Land', a store of dressing up for children throughout the school (not just the children in Reception) and a ban on football during playtime, has resulted in the children really enjoying their playtime together, using the new toys and resources to stimulate their imaginations.

The teachers say it's a joy to see the children play together so creatively rather than have the playground taken over by a football game that forces those not playing onto the fringes of the area. Of course, children will still enjoy football and other ball games during their PE lessons.

Mrs Farrow is always keen to offer new learning opportunities to the children. The Woolffe Art gallery was holding an exhibition in Froxfield and Mrs Burchett, Mrs Farrow and Mrs Ingham Thomas were invited to the private view – Mrs Burchett who leads on art in the school was very impressed by the quality and the range of the pieces on show so she was pleased to welcome Apolline Bokkerink from the Gallery to class 4 who enjoyed creating a miniature still life of goblets on tiny shelves.

This was inspired by Joanne Tinker's work 'Goblets' and Ms Bokkerink explained that she wanted to give the children the chance "to get their hands in" and so the whole class made a goblet from coloured sweet wrappers, and they were delighted that their own 'wall installation' was added to the exhibition!
